



National Parks & Wildlife Advisory Council 71st Meeting summary 9 September 2020.

The National Parks and Wildlife Advisory Council provides the Minister for Energy and Environment and the NPWS executive with independent, informed advice on a wide range of issues impacting national parks.

The following summarises matters considered by Council on 9 September 2020 at its 71st meeting which was held online to comply with COVID-19 restrictions.

NPWS Executive Director Park Programs Robert Quirk updated Council on NPWS priorities including:

- Bushfire response and recovery NSW Independent Bushfire Inquiry (findings and recommendations recently released), funding, resourcing, risk assessment, fire season preparation and fire trail upgrades.
- **Expansion of national parks estate** Acquisitions including Narriearra Station, Guula Ngurra National Park to protect koala habitat.
- Kosciuszko NP wild horse control, including the NSW Land and Environment Court challenge and ongoing research
- **COVID-19 recovery** campgrounds and visitor management including park user education, booking system and challenges of increased visitation rates.
- Cross tenure pest control, collaboration and approval processes.

Leases and licences

NPWS staff provided Council with a report on the current status of leases and licences on NPWS reserves.

Plans of Management

Council reviewed the forward plan for Plans of Management for 2020/21 and NPWS briefed Council on the Draft Plan of Management for Royal NP, Heathcote NP and Garawarra SCA.

Discussion and briefings

NPWS briefed Council on the:

- 2020/21 NPWS Business Plan and mechanisms for members to contribute
- NPWS Revocations Bill.

Council discussion also focussed on:

- Snowy Mountains Special Activation Precinct
- Conserving the natural values of parks in a time of increased usage
- Future management of park issues relating to diverse park use
- Council forward planning and strategic planning sessions.
