Operational Guidelines - Natural, Cultural, Park Users and Neighbours

Resource

ALL Brief all personnel involved in containment line construction and/or vehicle based fire suppression operations, on site locations and the required management strategies appropriate to the site type.

Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Site Management

- AH1 - As far as possible, protect site from fire. Do not cut down trees.
- AH2 - As far as possible, protect site from fire. Avoid all ground disturbance including the use of earthmoving machinery, hand-tool line construction and driving over sites. Avoid water bombing which may cause ground disturbance.
- AH3 - Avoid all ground disturbance. Avoid water bombing. Site may be burnt by builtfire, back-burn or prescribed burn without damage.

Historic Heritage Management

Three heritage sites that may require protection are shown on this map sheet as listed below.

Item ID	Site Name	Site Type	Protective Action Re-quired
6209	Bark Hut	Element	Vulnerable to fire. May require protection measures.
6209	Bark Hut Cattle Yards	Element	Vulnerable to fire. May require protection measures.
6410	Salt Hut	Element	Vulnerable to fire. May require protection measures.

Threatened Fauna Management

- Use of foam and retardant around the site is acceptable if authorized by the IC.
- There are no threatened fauna issues on this map sheet that require protective actions in the event of fire.
- As far as possible, protect large and hollow-bearing trees. Avoid inter-leave fires of <10 years. Avoid high intensity fires that consume canopies and fallen logs.
- Where practicable, protect habitat areas and trees from the fire if the effects of the resulting fire frequency, season and/or intensity will have a significant or unknown impact.
- Surfactants may be used except where location is within 50m of a watercourse, dam or swamp. All existing threatened frog records are displayed as an exclusion zone (50m exclusion of surfactants and other fire suppression chemicals).
- The following threatened flora are known to occur on this map sheet. Undertake protective actions as described below if possible.

Threatened Flora Management

Common Name or Flora Community	Protective Action Re-quired
Black She-oak Woodland / Forest	Limit fire use to ecological requirements. Caution with machine use near localities.
Gorge Wallie Dry Heath / Shrubland	Where possible avoid fire use.
Southern Dry Heath / Shrubland	Exclude fire and machine use where possible.

Threatened Property Management

- Table Top Hut APZ - Surrounding areas used extensively for research. Contact Guy Ballard (DPI) (0427 201 415) for details regarding on site equipment/personnel.
- Salt Tin Hut APZ
- Bark Hut APZ
- If possible, strengthen APZ areas around park assets prior to the arrival of wildfire and if possible defend them from fire.
- Where possible property owners with assets at risk from a wildfire event should be kept informed regarding the progress of the fire.
- No smoke management issues identified from this map sheet.

Smoke Management

- Access to park via Hobson's Trail is contentious - Call fire 6777 9194
- Salisbury Waters Walk Track should be checked for visitors - Low use, helicopter reconnaissance required
