Operational Guidelines - Natural, Cultural, Park Users and Neighbours

Resource Guidelines

- ALL: Brief all personnel involved in containment line construction and/or vehicle based fire suppression operations, on site locations and the required management strategies appropriate to the site type.
- Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Site: Aboriginal sites have been categorised with the following protective actions if possible in the event of a fire.
 - AH1 - As far as possible, protect site from fire. Do not cut down trees.
 - AH2 - As far as possible, protect site from fire. Avoid all ground disturbance including the use of earthmoving machinery, hand-tool fire construction and driving over site. Avoid water bombing which may cause ground disturbance.
 - AH3 - Avoid all ground disturbance. Avoid water bombing. Site may be burnt by sunlight, back-burn or prescribed burn without damage.

Historic Heritage Management

- The following heritage sites that may require protection from fire as shown on this map sheet:

Item ID	Site Name	Site Type	Protective Action Required
0238	Left Hand Hut	Shrubland	Vulnerable to fire. May require protection measures.
10152	Middle Creek Tin Mines Hut 1	Shrubland	Traces remain. May require protection measures.
10153	Middle Creek Tin Mines Hut 2	Shrubland	Traces remain. May require protection measures.
6432	Middle Yards Hut	Shrubland	Vulnerable to fire. May require protection measures.
6435	Middle Yards Stockyards	Shrubland	Traces remain. May require protection measures.
9787	Daisy Plains Huts	Shrubland	Vulnerable to fire. May require protection measures.
9786	Daisy Plains Village	Complex	Heavy machinery exclusion, may require protection measures.

- Avoid all ground disturbance including the use of earthmoving machinery, handline construction and driving over sites. Avoid water bombing, which may damage site.
- Use of foam and retardant around the site is acceptable if authorised by the IC.
- Two records of threatened frogs vulnerable to fire fighting chemicals exist on this map sheet. As far as possible, protect upland and holo-bombing trees. Avoid use of 10 years. Avoid high intensity fires that consume canopies and fallen logs in locations where these species are known to occur.
- Where practicable, protect habitat areas and trees from the fire if the effects of the resulting fire frequency, season &/or intensity will have a significant or unknown impact.
- Surfactants may be used except where location is within 50m of a watercourse, dam or swamp. All existing threatened frog records are displayed as an exclusion zone (50m exclusion of surfactants and other fire suppression chemicals).
- The following threatened flora are known to occur on this map sheet. Undertake protective actions as described below if possible.

Common Name or Flora Community	Protective Action Required
Southern Dry Heath / Shrubland	Exclude fire and machine use where possible.
Carral Plateau Dry Heath / Shrubland	Exclude fire and machine use where possible.
Gulburn's Grenvillea	Avoid use of any fire wherever possible. Caution with machine use.

- As far as possible, avoid inter-fire intervals of <10 years where these species are known to occur. If possible avoid the use of earth moving machinery in locations where these species are known to occur.
- Where possible, protect old growth habitat trees.
- Surfactants may be used except where location is within 50m of a watercourse, dam or swamp.
- Daisy Plains Hut APZ
- Left Hand Hut APZ
- Middle Yards Hut APZ
- If possible, strengthen APZ areas around park assets prior to the arrival of wildfire and if possible defend them from fire.
- Where possible, protect assets with assets at risk from a wildfire event should be kept informed regarding the progress of the fire.
